## For Newsham Primary School:

## Information to show the Impact the Primary PE Funding is having on:

1. Newsham Primary School is one of 20 local First/Primary Schools that have pooled all Primary PE Funding to maintain the Blyth & Bedlington School Sport Programme. A service level agreement has been established across not just the Primary sector but also the Secondary schools that the pupils feed into which helps with transition at KS2/3

#### 2. This allows all schools:

- Access to a dedicated specialist PE teacher on a weekly basis. These teachers
  have a family of schools they work with, so a relationship is built up between
  the school, staff and pupils allowing for more effective teaching.
- Access to a competition/festival programme of 20 events for pupils in KS1&2 including dance & gymnastics. This is published at the end of the summer term so schools can plan well in advance.
- Working in partnership with other local schools has allowed for the best use
  of funding as equipment can be shared and facility hire/transport costs have
  been negotiated a much lower rate. Demonstrates best use of funding.
- Access to an extra-curricular programme of 20 weeks delivery provide by the local sports development unit at a specially negotiated rate. All coaches are 'quality assured' and have appropriate qualifications and clearances. They are all line managed by one person and feedback data is requested at the end of each delivery block.
- Weekly extra-curricular club run by School Sport Programme Teacher
- Access to local CPD opportunities
- Access to a 6 week FA Soccer Skills programme

# 3. The PE funding has allowed all year groups to access High Quality PE on a weekly basis.

- SSP teacher works in curriculum time with pupils on a weekly basis using our equipment bank
- SSP teacher runs a weekly extra-curricular club for KS2 pupils
- The Newsham Primary School Staff receive weekly CPD by working alongside SSP teacher. All staff can gain access to this throughout the year on a rotational ½ term delivery basis.
- This has allowed for a greater range of activities to be taught across KS1&2
   e.g. Tag Rugby, athletics, tennis, speed agility & quickness work, multi-skill &

- physical literacy, where we have provided the equipment to save costs to the school.
- Extra-curricular clubs have been in alternative sports e.g. Street dance,
   Ultimate Frisbee.

### 4. Competition entries 2011- 2014

The figures below shows the number of competitions entered and the number of pupil places accessed by Newsham Primary School over the 3 academic years 2011-2014.

The figures highlight the impact that the Primary PE Funding has had in this area:

2011 – 2012:	O competitions entered O competition places accessed	0 Boys	0 Girls
2012 – 2013:	4 competitions entered 76 competition places accessed	40 Boys	36 Girls
2013 – 2014:	10 competitions entered 230 competition places accessed	111 Boys	119 Girls

### In the period 2011 – 2014 this shows:

- 10 fold increase in the number of competitions entered by the school
- This will rise to a 19/20 fold increase by the end of 2016
- 0 230/year increase in the number of pupil places accessed at competitions/festivals

## 5. Staff professional development:

- In the year prior to the programme starting only 1 staff attended 1 external CPD courses.
- In the period 2012 2015, 7 staff places where accessed on 6 different external CPD courses

This is additional to the weekly CPD that staff receive in school whilst working alongside SSP teacher

In the past 3 academic years the standard of the performance by Newsham pupils has risen from finishing close to the bottom in all competitions entered to winning Hockey, Netball & New Age Bowling competitions and finishing 2<sup>nd</sup> in Football & Tag Rugby competitions by 2014.

In 2014 the School year 6 hockey team represented the Blyth & Bedlington region at the Northumberland School Games level 3 finals.

The high quality PE/competition will be impacting on the confidence and self-esteem of pupils as well as having a positive effect on attendance and classroom work (the school would obviously have to be able to prove this as any data would be theirs).

There are 19 competition/festival opportunities open to Primary schools and Newsham has already taken part in 10 this year. If Newsham continue to enter the same events as they did last year, they will have taken part in 19 out of 20 events by the end of 2016.

As someone involved in children's sport all my life it has been fantastic to watch the development of talent at Newsham Primary School over the past 3 years and your PE coordinator, Louise Callan working with Angela Parsons has been instrumental in this.
