Newsham Primary School

Sport and PE are an integral part of our provision at Newsham Primary School. We are allocated funding to support our PE programme, however, we spend far in excess of this total. The school have been recognised for achievement in this area through the award of a Bronze Sports Mark.

We have been supported in our work by the award of Sports Premium funding. The total that we received is £19,438
